1647154	This class's greatest strength is its content, particularly in the first half. It is engaging, interesting, and highly relevant to modern African issues. The mechanism by which the content was delivered, however, was often a little too slow for my liking. It was possible to only half-listen to lectures and still understand a majority of the content being discussed. Readings were discussed at length in class, so reading them typically served no external purpose, and sections generally didn't contain enough content to justify their length. On the other hand, Professor Baldwin is a genuinely wonderful person who cares deeply about her students' learning and works hard, and successfully, to ensure individual engagement, so I was never bored in class, and felt that everything we covered had a definite purpose.
